Job Responsibilities

- Meet monthly with the Deputy Director of Children's Programs to discuss upcoming and current student programs occurring on and off-site
- Work independently and alongside all instructors (Eureka Workshop classroom instructors, teaching artists, robotics instructors and volunteers) in the development and delivery of lesson plans and curricula
- Teach Eureka Workshop classes both virtually as well as in-person on and off-site
- Participate in "Lab" style classes where Eureka instructors (or community partners) test out newly developed lesson plans and activities
- Assist the Deputy Director of Children's Programs in the training of new staff members, community partners, and specialized volunteers who will be delivering classroom content
- Participate in training sessions that provide community partners with Eureka Workshop curricula
- Perform administrative tasks as the host of monthly DoodleJam online events
- Represent Eureka Workshop at off-site events such as STEM Fairs and other marketing opportunities

- Contribute to the creation and production of content for Eureka Workshop published media such as instructional videos, Project Snail Mail, Eureka @ Home projects, social media, and the department blog as needed
- Perform additional tasks as needed
